

Don't know when you'll be back? Maintain your place in the queue by suspending your holds. You can do this online, or ask us to do it.

To suspend your holds:

- Go to our website: www.lincoln.library.on.ca
- Sign in to your account under "Explore/My Account"
- Choose the "holds" tab when your account information appears
- Select the holds you wish to suspend
- Choose "Suspend" from the drop-down "Actions for selected holds" menu
- Click on the green "Go" button

When you are back from your holidays, repeat the above, but choose "Activate". We'll let you know when your items are ready for pickup.

As well, if you need to keep items a bit longer because you'll be away, let us know. Depending on what you are borrowing, we may be able to lengthen the loan period when you check your items out.

Don't forget that as long as you have access to the internet, you can borrow e-books, audiobooks, movies and magazines online 24/7. Go to our website, www.lincoln.library.on.ca, and you'll see E-Resource logos on our home page. OverDrive and Hoopla are sources for downloadable e-books, audiobooks and movies. Flipster has terrific magazines, and Freegal and Hoopla offer all genres of music. All you need is your library card number and password/PIN!
