

We Discovered Our Roots!






Celebrate the Irish!





This DVD follows wildlife cameraman Colin Stafford-Johnson on a journey along Ireland's Atlantic coast, describing the animals and places he discovers along the way.




Sister Fidelma returns in a new Celtic mystery.
