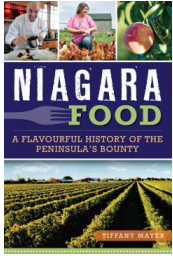
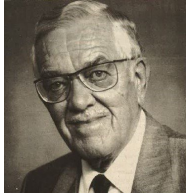

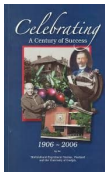
Books by William F. Rannie

Among the titles you can borrow are:

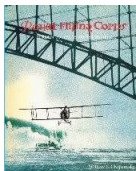
- Lincoln: the story of an Ontario town

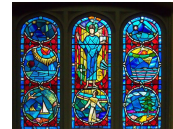

Lincoln Public Library owns numerous histories of local churches. Many of our resources are in our Local History collection in Vineland, but the following

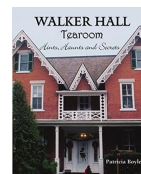
